MAJOR ANNOUNCEMENT: Marquette Acquires a New Tenant and Sells Naming Rights

The Marquette Home Building and Improvement Association (the council's legal entity that owns the building at 312-314 St. Charles Ave.) has entered into a long-term lease with the owner of the neighboring Daisy Dukes restaurant. The Daisy Dukes owner will be operating a new restaurant - *The Streetcar Café* - on the first floor of our building. Please support our tenant and his new restaurant.

In addition, we just recently accepted the tenant's offer to purchase the naming rights to 312-314 St. Charles Ave. Marquette Hall will now be officially known as the *Daisy Dukes Building*. To reflect this name change, the building's exterior will soon be painted yellow with black trim and signage will be added.



Therefore, when referring to the building formerly known as Marquette, we will refer to it as Daisy Dukes or the Daisy Dukes Building. For example: "Our next meeting will be on Wednesday, April 10th at the Daisy Dukes Building."

So that we do not breach or violate our agreement with Daisy Dukes, please properly identify the building by its new name in all emails, correspondence, and communications. Incorrectly identifying the property as "Marquette," "Marquette Hall," "the KC Hall" or by some name other than the Daisy Dukes Building will constitute a breach of the agreement and could expose us to legal liability. The specific terms of the agreement are secret and confidential and are not subject to disclosure under any circumstances. The name change and licensing agreement became effective April 1st. The Lord thus hijacks the Prophet Habakkuk, who was innocently carrying some boiled pottage to a team of reapers in the fields. God commissions him to tote the fare instead to Daniel's den in Babylon, to which Habakkuk—who is several months' journey away, in Judea—whines that he has no idea what this is all about. So the Lord yanks Habakkuk impatiently by the hair, wafts him by the wind and drops him down in the den, where he deposits the dinner and is promptly beamed back home. •
